

MINUTES OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL

OF THE

TOWNSHIP OF YORK.

FIRST MEETING.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, January 12th, 1903.

The members elected to fill the offices of Reeve and Councillors for the year 1903, namely :--Wm. Sylvester, Esq., Reeve, and Messrs. Geo. S. Henry, Wallace Maclean, Geo. Syme and John Wanless, jr., Councillors, met at 11 o'clock a.m. The declarations of qualification and office of each member being duly filed with the Clerk. The Reeve took the chair and delivered an inaugural address, after which the Council for 1903 was declared duly organized and open for general business.

FOR THE YEAR 1903.

To the Reeve and Council of the Township of York :

Gentlemen,—Under the authority of By-law No....., passed by your Council we have audited the accounts of the Township of York for the year ending 31st

December, 1903, and herewith present the following statements, namely : 1, Summary of Receipts and Disbursements. 2, Detailed Statement of Receipts. 3, Detailed Statement of Disbursements. 4, Schedule of School Loan Debenture Debt 5, Schedule of Local Improvement Debt. 6, Revenue Account. 7, Profit and Loss. 8, Balance Sheet.

The income from all sources for 1903 amounted to \$87,747.36, and the total expenditure \$83,034 56, leaving a balance of \$4,712.80, which has been transferred to the credit of Profit and Loss Account.

Profit and Loss Account: The credit balance of last year brought forward is \$575.46, and the profit for the year \$4,712.80, making a total of \$5,288.26. The Council authorized us to write of various accounts which have been carried as assets heretofore, and after debiting profit and loss account, there still remains a credit

of \$1,884.57. We have also examined authority for payments, together with vouchers, and do hereby certify the same to be correct. We have examined the securities held by the Treasurer and Imperial Bank in trust, and find them correct, and have verified the bank and cash balances. The securities furnished by the Township Treasurer con-sists of a guarantee bond for \$10,000 and a personal bond for \$20,000.

Your Auditors would call the attention of the Council to the shortage in the Sinking Fund of \$8,127.21.

We beg to report we found the books of the Municipality in excellent order. All of which is respectfully submitted.

A large wooden bridge on Gerrard Street has been in bad condition and caused considerable expense in repairs so as a matter of economy, and to lessen the risk of accidents, we removed the bridge and put in large sewer pipe and filled in the ravine at a cost of about \$200, but have used the old materials to advantage.

For some years there has been trouble by reason of the flooding of the lots at the north-east corner of Woodbine Avenue and the Kingston Road, and persons living on Woodbine Avenue to north of Kingston Road have urged the improvements of the hills and the filling in of the ravine and thus raise the walk and widen the embankment.

The Council had the south hill graded to permit of an open ditch and widened and raised the embankment and extended the culvert all at a cost of about \$600. As there was not sufficient funds to grade the north hill it was put off to another year.

There was a considerable washout on Lee Avenue by reason of the failure of the Don at Ames Fish Pond, this cost about \$100.

We have considerable expense in this division in keeping in repair sidewalks. We put about 350 feet of new 4 foot walk on Coxwell Avenue.

An expenditure was caused in this section by the washing out, by spring freshet, of the easterly end of the large bridge over the Don at Young's factory. Mr. Russel's contract to repair, including lumber, piles and pile driving, and iron, etc., came to \$246.63. At the time this bridge was built, as a local improvement, its location was good as the main body of water and ice in the spring freshets passed to the westerly side of the flats; thus not materially interfering with this bridge. On the construction of the Belt Line Railway, it was found necessary for the Railway Company to protect the Railway from the spring freshet and they built a long line of piling sheeted with plank, which turns the spring freshets, now to the site of the bridge, and each year causes large washouts in the banks of the Don at and adjoining the bridge and injures the bridge. This cannot be avoided without a large expenditure to protect the banks of the Don and the work would have to be done on private property. The proposed improvement of the Don by the city may help us.

A considerable expenditure has been caused in the repairs of sidewalks and culverts. In the repair of culverts we have used sewer pipe. It would be better to rebuild the sidewalks with brick, but R. Davies does not now make suitable brick.

The large bridge, of 2 spans, over the Don on the Pottery Road, and the adjoining bridge over the Head Race had to be repaired, costing about \$425.00.

We have a number of times recommended the raising of the 100 feet span steel bridge at the forks of the Don, on the Don Road, but Council did not wish to incur the expense. When built it was raised $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet higher than the old one of about 70 feet waterway; but since R. Davies removed the dam at the old upper paper mill, on the west branch of the Don, we have been troubled each spring. To aid the flow of water and ice, we have this year removed some trees which blocked the ice, and also widened and deepened part of the bed of the Don under and adjoining the bridge, and will have the fences on flats at the bridge removed, and will try to have the ice under and adjoining the bridge broken up before the heavy spring freshets.

On account of the high price and trouble in getting cedar posts during the summer, we have arranged to have 200 delivered at Don land station.

Parnham and Olive Avenues were graded. Moore Park steel bridge had repairs made to guards on roadway. The roadway at and under the south end of the high wooden bridge on Spadina Road, south of St. Clair, required a considerable expenditure in repairs on account of washouts. On account of the scarcity of stone and high price we made a deal with the Metropolitan Railway Co. for the delivery of about 100 toise of screened machine broken boulder stone at \$14 per toise delivered on Yonge Street. These stone are broken on the Schomberg Railway in King.

The main roads are Dundas Street, St. Clair Avenue, Jane Street, Scarlet Road. We have difficulty in getting good stone and gravel, until lately we got field stone from Etobicoke at about \$6 per toise, but cannot get them now for less than \$8, as the Township of Etobicoke is now buying and parties do not care to draw so far. We can get Humber shale stone but it is not good for macadam. We have arranged with P. Ryan to get coarse gravel from the old pit on Lot 37, Con. 3 from Bay. We have used brick from sidewalks on Dundas Street and built at a reasonable cost of about 30 cents per foot 4 feet walk as the Ontario Paving Brick works are near and we have fine gravel on Jane Street.

We have also built some gravel walks on St. Clair Avenue. The Scarlet Road is very bad in spring and fall on account of heavy shale teams. As our people use this road very little we have not spent much on it. The Black Creek bridge on this road requires considerable expenditure annually.

A few years ago there were plenty of stone and gravel for the roads at reasonable prices and men to break the stone, now stone cannot easily be got and secured only at a high price and it is difficult to get men to break the stone, so we have arranged with the Metropolitan R'y Co. to deliver about 100 toise part of which to go to Deer Park and counted on having some delivered at Davenport station on the Grand Trunk and the remainder on Yonge St. North. We have had some delivered on Yonge St. North and at Deer Park but were disappointed in getting some to Davenport Station. Our arrangement with the R'y Co. was \$14 per toise for machine broken stone screened. We have during 1903 done considerable grading and gravelling on the side roads. We have repaired the Don Bridge at Bathgate road, York Mills, and have repaired culverts by putting in sewer pipe. We repaired side walks to some extent on Yonge St., but much more is required in 1904. We did considerable drainage on Yonge St., assisted by the Metropolitan R'y Co.
