MINUTES OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL

OF THE

TOWNSHIP OF YORK.

FIRST MEETING.

COUNCIL CHAMBER, January 11th, 1904.

The members elected to fill the offices of Reeve and Councillors for the year 1904, namely:—William Sylvester, Reeve, George Syme, George S. Henry, John T. Watson and John Wanless, jr., Councillors, met pursuant to statute at 11 o'clock a.m. The statutory declarations of office and qualification of each of the members were duly filed with the Clerk, after which the Reeve took the chair and delivered a short address to the members, at the conclusion of which the Council of 1904 was declared duly organized according to law and open for the transaction of general business.

COMMUNICATIONS.

The following communications were received and read.—W. D. McNab, M.D., applying for the position of Medical Health Officer; Geo. Clay and W. H. Lucas applying for the position of Auditors for the year 1904. Armour & Mickle, Solicitors, asking on behalf of certain ratepayers of the Township the assistance of the Council in opposing the application of the Town of East Toronto for the annexation of a portion of the Township to said Town. The Clerk of Etobicoke Township, enclosing account for inspection by their M. H. O. of the Lambton Golf Club premises within the Township of York. The Township Clerk, certificate as to result of vote on Local Option By-law No. 1944. (Majority against 376.)

No. 2676. Wanless—Henry.—Whereas it has been made to appear to this Council that a large number of the property owners in the district which it is proposed to annex to the Town of East Toronto by Proclamation are opposed to

annexation. And whereas this Council are desirous of retaining the said district within the Township of York: Be it resolved that the Township Solicitors be and are hereby instructed to appear on the appointment before the Provincial Secretary on Tuesday, the 19th inst., and on any other appointment with reference thereto, and oppose such annexation. Carried.

No. 2677. Henry—Watson.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to accept the offer of H. Cook of \$800.00 for Lots 241 to 250 both inclusive according to Plan 719, Pleasant Ave., and that the Reeve and Clerk be and are hereby instructed to issue deeds for same, and that the seal of the Corporation be here to affixed. Carried.

No. 2678. Henry—Wanless.—Resolved that the standing committees for the year 1904 be as follows:—Roads and Bridges, East York, Messrs Henry and Wanless. Finance, The Council; and that the Reeve be ex-officio a member of all committees. Carried.

No. 2679. Syme—Watson.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to issue a cheque for \$5.00 for renewal of subscriptions for the "Municipal World," six copies, for the year 1904; and to this resolution the seal of the Corporation be affixed. Carried.

No. 2680. Wanless—Syme.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized and instructed to pay to each of the Deputy Returning Officers the sum of \$8.00 in full for services and disbursements for poll clerk and constable re Municipal election held January 4th, 1904; also to the owner or tenant of each polling booth the sum of \$4.00, and to this resolution the seal of the Corporation be affixed.

No. 2681. Syme—Watson.—Resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to pay the account of the "Tribune" for publishing the Township Treasurer's Financial Statement, 1903, being \$50.00 as per contract, and to this resolution the seal of the Corporation be attached. Carried.

SECOND MEETING.

COUNCIL CHAMBER, Feb'y 1st, 1904.

Council met at 2 p.m. Members all present. The minutes of the first meeting were read and adopted as amended.

COMMUNICATIONS.

The following communications were received and read:—M. O'Sullivan, claiming compensation for damages to vehicle and harness caused by alleged defective culvert on 4th Con., E. Y. The Clerk of Weston village, stating that the Village Council

wished to confer with the Council of the Township re service on the Suburban Street Railway, and asking that a date be fixed by the Council for a joint meeting. Thos. Rennie, asking that a hydrant be placed at the corner of Ellis Ave. and College St., to be used only in case of fire. Messrs. Robinette and Godtry, Solicitors for John Ford, giving notice of injury to Mr. Ford on Todmorden hill by a tree overhanging the road. J. Nelson, offer to purchase certain lots owned by the Township.

S. No. 26 and the present Union School Section, composed of the Town of East Toronto and Section 6 of the Township of York.

Council met at the call of the Reeve at 2 p.m., members all present.

F. C. Miller, asking that the snow and ice be removed from the ditches on Murray St. A. M. Campbell, requesting Council to put signs on the Richmond St. windows of the Township offices. The Township Solicitors, enclosing correspondence with Humber Power and Light Co. re delay in installing electric lamps on Davenport and Weston Roads.

Heslop has made application to this Council for a refund of school taxes paid by him through error in assessment of the N. ½ of Lot 26, Con. 3, F.B., of which he is a tenant; and whereas Sec. 71 (3) of "The Public Schools Act" provides that every municipal council shall have power, and it shall be the duty to correct any errors or omissions that may have been made within the three years next preceding such correction in the collection of any school rate duly imposed or intended so to be, to the end that no property shall escape from its proper proportion of the rate and that no property shall be compelled to pay more than its proper proportion of such rate. Be it therefore resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to refund to Jno. H. Heslop the sum of \$49.20, such sum being paid by the said Jno. H. Heslop in excess of the proper amount of school tax chargeable against the N. ½ of Lot 26, Con. 3 F.B. for the years 1900-1902 by reason of said property which is in S.S. No. 14 being erroneously assessed in S.S. No. 25; also, to credit S.S. No. 14 with \$28.72 and charge against S.S. No. 25 the sum of \$77.92, and to this resolution the seal of the Corporation be affixed. Carried.

Wanless—Henry.—Resolved that the Reeve and Treasurer of this Corporation be and are hereby authorized and instructed, pursuant to Sec. 435 (2a) of "The Consolidated Municipal Act, 1903" to borrow from the Imperial Bank of Canada such sum as may be required to meet current expenditure of the Corporation until such time as the balance due on taxes levied for the year, 1903, and the taxes to be levied for the current year can be collected and applied to redeem such loan; the sum so borrowed not to exceed the total amount of \$60,000 00, which shall be borrowed on open account or otherwise at such rate of interest on current overdraft as the said Reeve and Treasurer shall consider satisfactory, but not to exceed 5% per annum, and to this resolution the seal of the Corporation be affixed. FIFTH MEETING.

COUNCIL CHAMBER; April 4th, 1904.

Council met at 2 p.m., members all present. The minutes of the last meeting were read and adopted.

COMMUNICATIONS.

Received from :—The Secretary of the Board of Railway Commissioners for Canada giving notice that the application of the Township of York, to rescind or vary the Order of the Railway Committee of the Privy Council, dated 5th January, 1891, re Bathurst and Dufferin Street crossings by the C. P. Railway, will be heard by said Board on the 5th day of April, 1904, at 11 o'clock a.m. Chas. Kilvington, Main St., Dovercourt, complaining that the drains on the highways are closed with ice and snow, causing the water to flood his premises. Benj. Tomlin asking refund of statute labor tax charged against Lot 14, Tomlin Ave. A. J. Anderson, directing the attention of the Council to a flood of water west of Elizabeth St. and north of the C.P.R. tracks, caused by alleged blocking of the outlet by the C.P.R. The Township Solicitors, re Dufferin and Rathurst crossings ; enclosing letter from the Solicitors of the C.P.R. threatening immediate action against the Township to enforce the judgment of the Court of Appeal if the Township portion for maintenance of the gates at said crossings is not forthwith paid. Joseph Barrett, applying for permission to construct, maintain and operate a pole-line with over-head wires and superstructures along or cross the highways in that portion of the Township west of Yonge St. for the purpose of transmitting electricity from his proposed generating works at Erindale on the river Credit into and through the Township for the supply of light, heat and power for public and private purposes &c. E. J. Bagsley recommending for the consideration of the Council the construction of certain public works in the Dovercourt District. The Township Engineer, giving estimate of cost of survey (\$200.00) of the line of the original road allowance running in the rear of lots 39 and 40 in the Broken Front Concession in the Township of York from Ellis Avenue westward to the River Humber, as set forth in the petition by the Council to the Lieutenant Governor of the Province. The Moffat Stove Co., re Holland v York Township. Henry Holgate re Glen Road Bridge. J. A. Macdonald re Young's Rendering Factory, Don flats.

No. 2703. Wanless—Watson.—Resolved that the Solicitors be and are hereby instructed to notify the Toronto and Suburban Ry. Co. that no cars have been run on the Davenport Road and Lambton Mills Sections of their line for a considerable time as required by their agreement with this Municipality, and that as a consequence this Corporation find it necessary to take into consideration the legal position of the Company under the circumstances. Carried.

The main roads are the Kingston Road, Woodbine Avenue, Lee Avenue, Queen Street, Coxwell Avenue, Berkley Avenue, Gerard Street and other short roads leading north from Queen Street partly in the City and at other places. We cannot at present get boulder field stone for macadam, but when the Toronto and York Radial Railway is extended to the Highland Creek we will get the stone the same as now from the Township of King, via the Schomberg and Yonge Street lines.

At present we use, generally, coarse screened gravel for the Kingston Road, breaking the larger stone. There is very heavy traffic on this road from the Gravel and Sand Pits in the Townships of York and Scarboro.

We get very good gravel from our pit on the town line of York and Scarboro, to the south of the Grand Trunk Railway, which we use on Woodbine Avenue, Lee Avenue, Coxwell Avenue, Dawes Road, &c., &c.

The high sidewalk and embankment on Queen Street at Munroe Park was repaired at a considerable expense, including rebuilding part of the sidewalk, filling in the embankment and

putting cinders on the roadway and embankment. We got cinders delivered on the roadway from the Toronto Railway Co. In making new or repairing old culverts we have used sewer pipe generally.

Owing to the failure of the water supply for the Town of East Toronto we could not get sufficient water to keep down the dust on the Kingston Road. As the Town is now connecting their pipes with the Lake, we will get plenty in the future. Water mains are now being laid by the City on a number of our roads.

Owing to the flat and wet character of part of this section south of the Davenport Road we graded a number of the roads and ditched them to prepare them for gravel or macadam. We have the same difficulty as to drainage in this section as in the Bracondale section. McKenzie Avenue and part of the Davenport Road to west of it were in a very bad condition on account of the heavy travel by teams hauling gravel, sand and brick, &c. to the city, also the traffic in connection with the building of the

Canada Foundry and the delivery of machinery. We tried to get the company to ask for a Local Improvement, proposing that the Council should pay one-third, but did not get them to take action. We asked for tenders for improving McKenzie Avenue and part of the Davenport Road with macadam, but on account of the high tender the work did not go on, so we made the ordinary improvement with gravel on the old bed of cedar, and also improved the drainage.

BY-LAW NO. 1910,*As Amended by By-Law 1992.***To Divide the Municipality Into Commuted Statute Labor Districts and to State Certain Regulations Governing the Department of Works.**

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient for the more equitable and systematic expenditure of the Statute Labor Tax, and a portion of the General Township Tax, and for other purposes, that the Municipality should be formally divided into districts.

AND WHEREAS in order to insure the successful and satisfactory performance of the different public works in this municipality it is necessary to have well defined methods and regulations and certain amounts set apart annually for the benefit of the hereinafter mentioned sections for the guidance of those employed by the Corporation.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of York :

1. That from and after the passing of this by-law the municipality shall be divided into fourteen Commuted Statute Labor Districts, and shall be known and described and their limits shall be fixed and determined respectively as hereinafter set forth, namely :

District No. 1.

NORWAY SECTION.—Comprising Lots 1 to 9, inclusive, in the Concession F.B., and broken fronts, excepting parts within the limits of the City of Toronto and Village of East Toronto, and the Northern parts of Lots 1, 2 and 3 to north of said village.

District No. 2.

COLEMAN SECTION.—Comprising Lots 1 to 5, inclusive, in the second and third Concessions F.B., and those parts of Lots 1, 2 and 3, Concession 1 F. B., north of the G. T. Ry., exclusive of all those parts annexed to the Town of East Toronto.

District No. 3.

TODMORDEN SECTION.—Comprising Lots 6 to 15, inclusive, in the second Concession F.B., and Lots 6 to 11, inclusive, in the third Concession F.B.

District No. 4.

DEER PARK, EAST AND WEST.—And comprising those portions of Lots 16 to 20, inclusive, Concession 2 F.B., Lots 12 to 15, inclusive, and Lots 19 and 20, Concession 3, F.B., east of Yonge street, and Lots 21 to 24, inclusive, in second and third Concessions F.B., west of Yonge Street.

District No. 5.

BRACONDALÉ SECTION.—Comprising Lots 25 to 29, inclusive, in the second and third Concessions F.B.

District No. 6.

DAVENPORT SECTION.—Comprising Lots 30 to 33, inclusive, in the second and third Concessions F.B.

District No. 7.

SWANSEA SECTION.—Comprising Lots 38 to 41, inclusive, in the first Concession F.B., and Lot 1, H.R.

District No. 8.

LAMBTON SECTION.—Comprising Lots 38 to 40, inclusive, Concession two F.B., and Lots 2 to 10, inclusive, H.R.

District No. 9.

MOUNT DENNIS SECTION.—Comprising Lots 34 to 40, inclusive, Concession three F.B., and Lots 1 to 4, inclusive, in the fourth and fifth Concessions west of Yonge Street.

District No. 10.

YONGE STREET SECTION.—Comprising lots 1 to 35, inclusive, in the first Concession east of Yonge Street, and Lots 1 to 25, inclusive, west of Yonge Street.

District No. 11.

DON SECTION.—Comprising Lots 1 to 14, inclusive, in the second, third and fourth Concessions east of Yonge Street.

District No. 12.

L'AMAROUX SECTION.—Comprising Lots 15 to 25, inclusive, in the second, third and fourth Concessions east of Yonge Street.

District No. 13.

DOWNSVIEW SECTION.—Comprising Lots 1 to 16, inclusive, in the 2nd and 3rd Concessions, and Lots 5 to 16, inclusive, in the 4th, 5th and 6th Concessions west of Yonge Street.

District No. 14.

ELIA AND EMERY SECTION.—Comprising Lots 17 to 25, inclusive, in the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Concessions west of Yonge Street.

2. The Treasurer shall open accounts in the Ledger of the Township for each and all of the fourteen aforementioned districts, which shall show on the debit side the amount expended by the Engineers in these districts from month to month during each year, and there shall appear on the credit side of the ledger accounts, the amount of Commuted Statute Labor as furnished by the Clerk, and such other sums from the general Township rates as the Council may see fit to place at the disposal of the Engineers for the expenditure on public works in each of the said Fourteen Districts.

3. On request of any ratepayer or petition of any number of ratepayers, the Council may grant such sum as they deem fit to be expended in such way as the Council in their wisdom may deem best, in any of the Divisions over and above the Statute Labor, but all petitions or requests must be in not later than the first meeting of June in each year.

4. A Foreman or Foremen shall be appointed by the Engineers for one or more of the aforesaid Commuted Statute Labor Districts, and every Foreman employed shall devote the whole of his time during the period he is receiving pay therefor, and shall engage in similar work to that of the men engaged under him, unless otherwise ordered or permitted by the Engineers. Each such Foreman or Foremen shall employ only men who shall perform the duties assigned to them with intelligence, diligence and faithfulness, and in no case shall men be employed or refused employment through the exertion of influences opposed to appointments on real merit. Preference, however, all other qualifications being equal, shall be given to heads of families and residents of the im-

mediate district. No Foreman, while in the pay of this Corporation, shall be eligible to tender or contract for any works, and he is hereby debarred from tendering or contracting for any works for this Corporation during the period of his employment as such Foreman.

5. No Foreman shall employ his own team directly, indirectly or by evasive means, without permission from the Council, nor shall he employ any member of his own family, unless the said member be the head of a family, and all teams employed by this Corporation by day labor or otherwise as the case may be, shall be the bona fide property of the party or parties engaged therefor. Foremen shall take the best care of all machinery, tools and implements, the property of the Municipality, under their charge, and when not being used they shall be adequately protected from the weather.

6. That no Foreman appointed by the Township Engineers under By-law No. 1634, shall undertake any work without direct instructions from said Engineers, nor shall any Foreman continue to work after receiving orders from the Engineers to cease; provided always that in the event of a broken culvert, bridge or washout, subsidence or any other serious damage or obstruction to the roadway, the Foreman shall at once notify the said Engineers of the damage, and immediately proceed to so far repair or guard the same as to allow the public to travel in safety until the arrival of, or receipt of instructions from, the said Engineers.

7. Foremen are required to notify the Township Engineers of any drain, culvert, bridge, sidewalk, or guard railing within their respective section which they consider requires to be renewed.

7. (a) Each foreman shall specify in his monthly pay sheet to be sent in to the Township Engineers each day of the month on which he was working, on what work he was engaged, and for how long (when not for a whole day), and shall also in his pay sheet give information to the like effect with regard to each of the names appearing on the pay sheet.

7. (b) Where material has been used in connection with any work, the foreman shall specify in his pay sheet where such material was used and the work it was used in, and as nearly as possible the quantity and value of each material.

8. All new public works are to be initiated only by By-law or resolution of the Council, and when of sufficient size may be performed under contract and carried out under the supervision of the Township Engineers. All tenders for construction work by contract within the Township shall be accompanied by a sufficient deposit, adjudged by the Council, as a guarantee of good faith and willingness to insure the due and proper performance of the work or works, and in case the contractor or contractors to whom the work is given fail to observe the conditions and provisions in the said tender or tenders, the said deposit shall be forfeited to and become the property of the Corporation of the Township of York.

9. Tenders for all material for roads and bridges shall be called for annually, and if the prices quoted are satisfactory to the Council, the said material shall be ordered and measured, and inspected by the Engineers, or by other such person or persons as they shall authorize, and all accounts for labor and material are to be certified by the said Engineers and the Foreman of the District, and paid by the Township Treasurer by cheque only to the order of the respective persons entitled thereto.

9. (a) All tenders for work or material shall be sealed and sent to the Finance Committee of the Council, accompanied by a deposit as set by the Council, and marked "Tenders for public works."

10. That no account in Engineers' Department be paid unless same is included in Engineer's pay sheets and passed by Council.

10. (a) It shall be the duty of the Engineers to report to the Council at least once in each month the amount expended, both in labor and material, in connection with each bridge and culvert in the Municipality and to keep in a book an account in connection with each such bridge and culvert, showing all moneys expended in connection therewith, the nature of the work or improvement, and the date of such expenditure; said book to be kept on file in the office of the Township Clerk.

10. (b) It shall be the duty of the Engineers to give annually to the Council on or before the first Monday in April a report of the condition of the bridges in the Township and a statement of the improvements proposed on such bridges for the year.

11. The Engineers in conjunction with the Clerk and Treasurer shall prepare an annual general report for incorporation with the printed minutes and auditor's report of the Municipality, showing :

(a) An indication of the amount and of where and for what Township funds are expended in the different Sections during each year.

(b) A list of tools, implements and machinery owned by the Municipality with locations, conditions and value.

(c) A list of the names and addresses of the foremen employed by the Engineers' Department with the entire salaries received by each in the year.

(d) A statement showing the assessments and amounts paid by each section for Statute Labor Tax and Township rates.

12. The failure of any employee to observe and be guided by the foregoing enactments, shall upon proof be regarded as an act of insubordination and render the offender liable to summary dismissal by the Council.

13. That this By-law shall go into force forthwith and that By-law No. 1669 and all other By-laws enacted by this Corporation inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

AUDITORS' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR 1904.

To the Reeve and Council of the Township of York :

Gentlemen,—Under the authority of By-law No. 1986, passed by your Council, we have audited the accounts of the Township of York for the year ending 31st December, 1904, and herewith present the following statements, namely :

1, Summary of Receipts and Disbursements. 2, Detailed Statement of Receipts. 3, Detailed Statement of Disbursements. 4, Schedule of School Loan Debt. 5, Revenue Account. 6, Profit and loss. 7, Balance sheet.

The income from all sources for 1904 amounted to \$112,906.62, and the total expenditure, \$112,241.60. Leaving a balance of \$665.02, which has been transferred to Profit and Loss Account.

Profit and Loss Account : The credit balance of last year brought forward is \$1,884.57, and the profit for the year, \$665.02, making a total of \$2,549.59.

We have also examined the securities held by the Treasurer and Imperial Bank in trust ; we find them correct. We have examined the authority for all payments, together with with vouchers, and hereby certify the same to be correct. We have verified the Bank and cash balances. The securities held by the Clerk and furnished by the Township Treasurer, consisting of a guarantee bond for \$10,000.00 and a personal bond for \$20,000.00.

Your auditors would call your attention to the shortage in the Sinking Fund of \$8,602.88. This amount is growing larger yearly, owing to the accrued interest being cut off. The Council of 1904 and for many years previous has provided the necessary amounts due to sinking funds for that year to cover the above amount.

In conclusion we beg to state that we found the books of the Township neatly and accurately kept, although additional work has been placed upon them owing to the rapid growth of the municipality.
