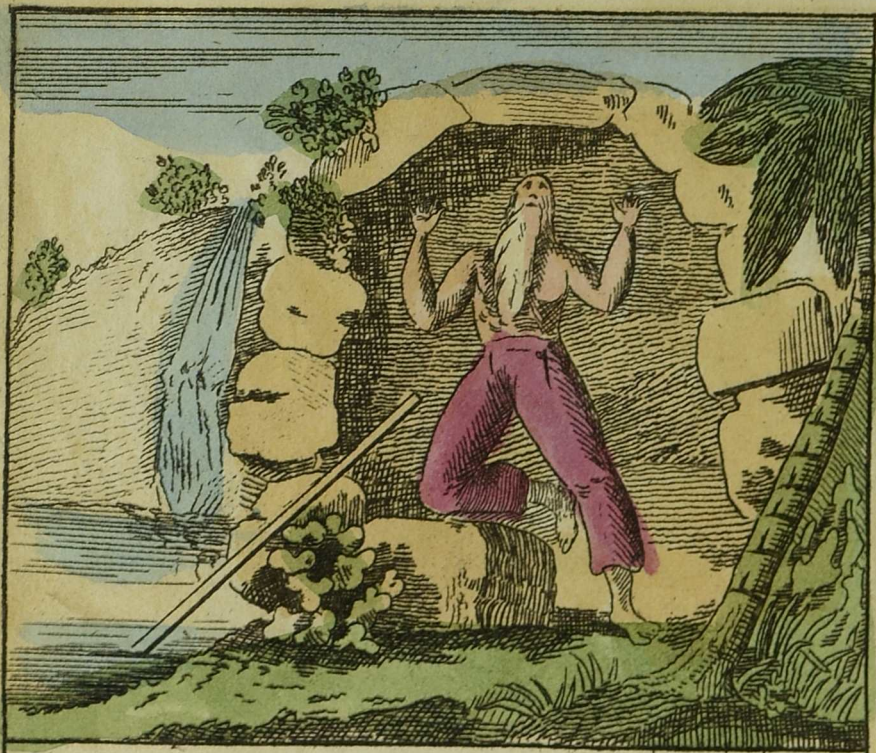


The earth now digging doth Quarll find.
