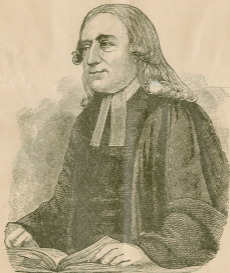

At the death of John Wesley there were only 71,463 members in his societies in the Old World and 48,610 in the New. What hath God wrought!

Methodism throughout the world publishes 164 weekly, monthly, or quarterly periodicals.

The Methodist Episcopal Church of the United States has 143 colleges, universities and higher institutions of learning, with buildings and grounds, to the value of \$7,584,640; endowments, \$7,300,176; debts, \$592,474; professors and teachers, 1,405; students, 28,591; students from the beginning, 413,906.

## Events In the Life of John Wesley.

John Wesley was born at Epworth Rectory, June 17th, 1703.

He entered Oxford University a week after his seventeenth birthday, June, 1720.

He was ordained as a deacon in the Church of England by Bishop Potter in 1725.

He was unanimously elected Fellow of Lincoln College in 1726.

The Holy Club of Oxford was organized in 1729.

He sailed for Georgia October 21, 1735, and returned to England in 1738.

John Wesley was converted Sunday evening, May 24, 1738.

The first Love-feast was held at Fetter Lane, London, January 1, 1739.

The first Methodist Society was organized at the Foundery in London, July 20, 1740.

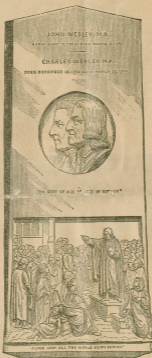
The first Wesleyan Conference was held January 5, 1744, seven ministers being present.

John Wesley's original prose works comprise fourteen closely printed volumes; his commentaries, compilations, and abridgments form a list of one hundred and nineteen publications in prose, one of which, entitled "A Christian Library," contains fifty volumes. Besides these prose works, he published fifty-two separate works in poetry, the joint productions of himself and his brother Charles; and, lastly, five publications in music, and collections of tunes.

His industry and activity never were, never can be, exceeded. It is estimated that during the fifty years of his itinerant ministry he travelled over a quarter of a million miles, and preached more than forty-two thousand sermons.
