RAILROAD RATES.

From Tuesday to Saturday, November 15th to 19th, return tickets at single fare rate plus twentyfive cents may be purchased at any railway station within eighty-three miles of Toronto. The Coupon attached to the railway ticket will entitle the purchaser to free admission to the Provincial Horticultural Exhibition. These tickets are good for return up to November 21st.

Those coming from beyond this radius will be required to secure certificates which, when signed by the Secretary of the Exhibition, will entitle them to free return, upon payment of twenty-five cents for having the certificate vised. These tickets can be secured from November 11th to 19th inclusive, and will be good for return up to and including November 23rd, 1910.

ACCOMMODATION.

Upon arrival at Toronto, delegates will please call at the Ontario Government Immigration Office where they will be furnished with the names of hotels and private houses prepared to give accommodation at reasonable rates. This,office is a short distance west of the Union Depot on the opposite side of the street.

The Members of the Provincial Fruit Growers' and Bee Keepers' Associations, as well as The Household Economics Association, Women's Canadian Club, Women's Medical Society, and other women's societies in the City, will be invited to attend the Thursday Session.

The Horticultural Exhibition will be found of great interest to Institute delegates, and we would advise those who reach the City early on Wednesday to spend two or three hours at the Exhibition before the Institute Convention opens.
