

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



# S<sup>T</sup> PATRICK.




S<sup>t</sup> Patrick, Ireland's valiant Knight,

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## S<sup>T</sup> DENNIS.




S<sup>t</sup> Dennis this, the Knight of France,

# S<sup>t</sup>. Dennis disenchanting fair Eglantine.




The King of Thessaly's daughter see,

## ST. JAMES.





St. James, the Champion was of Spain,

# ST ANTHONY.




St Anthony a noble Knight,
